Many of you are aware of the SON-SHINE SINGERS from Bethlehem Deaf L.C., Omaha, Nebraska, who have brought their Gospel message to many people through Sign Language and pantomime.

A good friend and strong supporter of the SON-SHINE SINGERS was DANICA DUS. This young lady, although confined to a wheelchair, was ever so cheerful and encouraging. She was called home by the Lord

on April 16, 1983. She was involved in an automobile accident and fatally injured.

The deaf co-director of the SON-SHINE SINGERS, Dorothy Sparks, wrote the following in remembrance of Danica.

A Good Artist

A sunset picture of dew on a pampas blade of grass won Omaha residence Dorothy Sparks second place in a national photography contest last March. Dorothy Sparks is an active member of Bethlehem.

Sparks won this award at the Seventh Annual Creative Arts Festival, held at the Center of Deafness in Des Plaines, Illinois.

About 276 Deaf people from 36 states, plus four Nebraskans entered the contest said the Center's Creative Arts Coordinator Cecilia Strejc.

The center wants to encourage Deaf people's creative talents and offered three main categories including Art and Creative Writing and Talent.

Sparks brought home a second place ribbon from the photography division in the Arts category.

She used a 35mm camera to take the picture of dew on a pampas. Pampas is a grassy weed that looks like wheat Sparks captured this shot by using a special camera lens filter.

The Omaha shutter bug had enjoyed taking pictures since she was a student at the Nebraska School for the Deaf. Sparks said her interest in photography was encouraged by her NSD houseparent Marlene Voss.

Dorothy graduated from NSD in 1973 and is the daughter of Don and Elsie Sparks and the sister of Al Sparks.

The entire Sparks family graduated from NSD. And family members have lived in Omaha since 1940.

Translator's Notebook: "GRACE"

Recently, the interpreters of Hope Church, Aurora, Ill., met to work on translators problems in Christian worship. One difficult word is GRACE.

In English and Greek, GRACE means many different things, depending on context. Traditionally, Lutheran deaf ministers (I mean ministers who sign/preach to deaf congregations) sign the word "Mercy" or "Pity" in place of the word GRACE. Some churches have invented signs incorporating the letter "G" to communicate some thing of the nature of God's grace. One sign pictures "Showers" of blessings. Another sign pictures God Himself coming to live in a person/s heart.

There is a particular drawback to inventing signs for English words. It's like Theologians inventing big \$10.00 words from Latin or Greek to communicate a difficult theological concept (idea). Only they know what they are talking about.

So, too, with invented signs. Native signers will not be sure of the concept behind the new sign. Nor will the sign be appropriate for every use of the equivalent English word. It is better to use the vocabulary of the existing language to communicate the concept in mind.

In some cases GRACE may be signed "Mercy". Many times GRACE may be signed "God's Love" a few times the word may be translated as "Gift" or "Power".

God's Grace is all those things, and more.

GRACE is ...
God's
Riches
At
Christ's
Expense.

And there is no one sign that can encompass various demonstrations of God's grace.

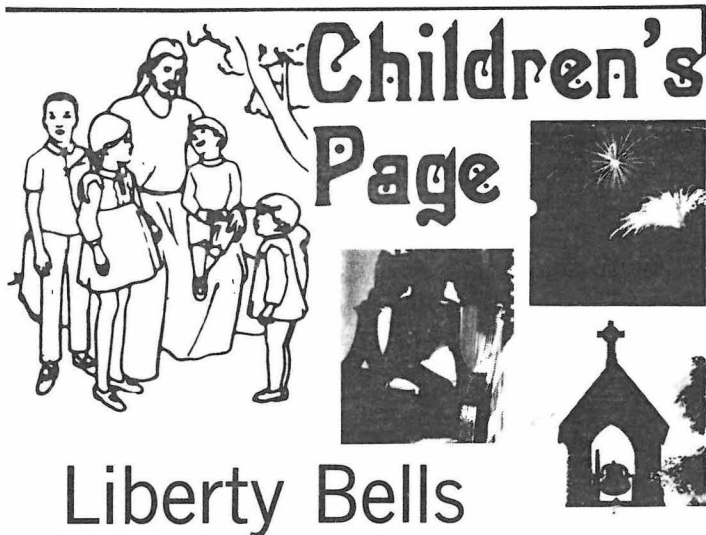
THE DEAF LUTHERAN editor, Archie D. Marshall arrived at the board meeting at this point. He apologized for the lateness in getting out each issue of the publication. His reasons were: 1. The almost impossible burden of working day & night, and that his regular job was very demanding which left him drained at the end of each day 2. His blood pressure has gone up such as to require medication. 3. He held out as long as he could hoping for an early retirement so as to work full time for ILDA, however, since such is not forthcoming, today he tendered his resignation as editor.

The Board of Directors accept Archie D. Marshall's resignation, effective immediately. They asked him if he would be willing to stay on as interim editor until a replacement was found, and Mr. Marshall accepted.
