"Make Christ the Holy Lord in your hearts. And always be ready to answer anyone who asks you to explain the hope you have, but be gentle and respectful." 1 Peter 3:15

As I am writing this, students across the country are getting ready for final exams. For some classes they have to study, study, study for many hours or many days. In other classes, they might look over their notes once... perhaps not even once. In some classes, the students already know exactly what they have to study, in other classes they aren't sure if the final exam will cover the readings from the textbook, the classroom lectures, the additional assigned readings or perhaps something else. I had one college professor who would give us the entire test a week before the test day so we could take it home and study. The day of the test, he would give us the exact same test, same questions, same order, same answers. The only students who didn't get them all correct were the students who didn't take the time to study. When final exams come, the students need to be ready to answer the questions.

In God's Word, written in Peter's first letter, Peter tells us to always be ready to answer anyone who asks us to explain the hope we have. Let me explain a little about the word "hope." In today's world, "hope"

seems to mean "cross your fingers and wish for something... like winning the lottery." That isn't what hope means for Christians. Deaf people have a better understanding of "hope" than hearing people do because in ASL, hope and expect are signed the same way. The hope we have is an expectation. We have the hope (expectation) of a blessed reunion in Heaven.

We need to be ready to explain that hope. We need to be ready to explain about Jesus. We need to be ready to explain about the forgiveness of sins. We need to be ready to explain what it means to be a Christian.


Can you do it? Can you explain your faith to an unbeliever? Can you tell someone why you believe in Jesus, why you know that your sins are forgiven and why you know you will go to Heaven? Every Christian should be able to do this. There are so many people who don't know about sin, don't know why Jesus died on the cross, don't know that He rose again and don't know that He is coming again. We need to be ready to tell them, so that they, like us, will be ready to meet Jesus when the time comes. Always be ready to give an answer...

Two motions submitted for review, memory refresher of what the Constitutions and Bylaws and Handbook states...

• As stated in the Constitutions and Bylaws:

Article VI: Officers, Section B - Officers and Terms of Office

- 1. No individual can serve more than one office in the ILDA and its regional branches at the same time.
- 2. Officers must be twenty-one (21) years of age or older.
- 3. No officer may hold the same office for more than two (2) consecutive terms.
- 4. Any officer who has been removed from office shall not be permitted to run for or hold office in the ILDA or its regional branches for a period of five (5) years.

Article XI: CONVENTIONS

The ILDA shall hold conventions every two (2) years in oddnumbered years. Regional branches are encouraged to meet in even-numbered years. The conduct as well as all plans, conditions and provisions shall be set forth in this Constitution and its Handbook. All of the ILDA conventions shall be selfsupporting.

Article XIV: ILDA Handbook, Section B - Changes

- The Board of Directors, by an affirmative vote of a two-thirds majority may add, delete, change, modify or alter any of the articles in the Handbook as they believe necessary without convention approval.
- 2. Each section cannot be changed more than one time in any calendar year and all changes shall be printed in The Deaf Lutheran.
- 3. A section of the rules may be repealed from this Handbook by a majority vote at the ILDA convention. Any repealed section cannot be changed by the Board of Directors, but must be approved by another ILDA convention before becoming effective.

Article XX: Amendments

Resolutions proposing the amendment, modification, alteration or repeal to the articles of this Constitution may be made by regional branches, congregations and/or fields or the Law Committee.

All resolutions of amendment, modification, alteration or repeal must be given to the membership either through the pages of The Deaf Lutheran or by written letter to all

congregations, fields and persons involved in the pastoral ministry with deaf persons of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod at least ninety (90) days prior to the ILDA convention.

An affirmative vote of two-thirds of the active members present at a legally constituted meeting at the ILDA convention shall be required to amend, modify, alter or repeal the articles of this Constitution.

As described above, the followings are required to be published in the Deaf Lutheran newsletter before the ILDA Convention...

Motion #1...

"I move that the conventions of the International Lutheran Deaf Association be every three years beginning in 2012."

Motion made by Donna Wright, member of Saint Matthew's Lutheran Church of the Deaf, Elmhurst, New York.

• As stated in the ILDA Handbook:

Article IX: ILDA OFFICERS Section A - The President

- 1. The president may serve only one term of two years, but may be re-elected as president-elect for one additional term.
- 2. The president shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee.
- 3. The president shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors and the Executive Council.
- 4. The president shall be responsible for making an annual report of all ILDA business and progress to the Board of Directors and to the ILDA convention.
- 5. The president shall determine the necessity of and have authority to call meetings of the Board of Directors, Executive Council and the various committees at any time.
- 6. The president may poll the Board of Directors or the Executive Council in writing and/or by TTY at any time for directions essential to the operation of the ILDA.
- 7. The president shall prepare the agenda for the Executive Council meetings early enough for the secretary to send it out prior to the meeting.
- 8. The president shall appoint the following chairmen: a. Mission Projects.
 - b. The U. C. Jones Memorial Right Hand Award.
 - c. Scholarship Fund.
 - d. The ILDA God's 1000 Club.
- 9. The president shall conduct a training program for all members of the new Board of Directors during the ILDA convention.
- 10. The president must keep in close contact and expect to receive quarterly reports from the convention host chairman.

Motion #2... request for repeal of section A, Article IX, item #1...

In its place, the following words shall be substituted:

Article IX, Section A:

 "The president, following completion of one term of two years, may be re-elected to a second term of two years by a majority vote of the members present at the following convention."

Obituary for Clarence F. Schulz...

Clarence F. Schulz, 85, died Friday, September 24, 2004, at Chestnut Lane, Assisted Living for the Deaf and Deaf Blind in Gresham, Oregon.

He was born in Vernon, Texas on November 20, 1918, to William and Eleanor (Zschech) Schulz. His father had been a Lutheran minister. Clarence graduated from the Lutheran School for the Deaf in



Detroit, as well as later earning an associate's degree from Macomb County Community College. He married Nonie Estelle Watson on November 23, 1951, in Washington, D.C.

He was a printer, retiring from the Detroit News in 1984. He spent his retirement years in Florida and California. He was a practicing Lutheran and always attended church on Sunday. The primary church of his life was Our Savior Lutheran Church for the Deaf in Detroit. He assisted starting and was the President of the International Lutheran Deaf Association for three years. Clarence enjoyed reading and current events, travel, golf and bowling, was a painter of fine art, and was a life long student of art and history. His volunteer hours were given to the Lutheran Church or to the deaf.

Clarence is survived by his daughter Pam Schulz of Culver City, CA; his daughter Nancy Schulz of Palo Alto, CA; and his grandchildren Sydney and Drew Lundgren.

He was preceded in death by his wife Nonie and by his sister Lucille Schulz Klein.

A memorial service was held at Chestnut Lane on Monday, September 27. His burial was on October 2 at Glen Eden Lutheran Memorial Park, 35667 W. Eight Mile Road, Livonia, MI. Pastor Dunseth of Our Savior Lutheran Church for the Deaf in Birmingham will provided service.

Praise God we are back from our honeymoon trip to Ghana, Africa. What a great time we had. Not only was it interesting but it also helped the two of us grow closer together. We were able to go to two different deaf schools to teach them about Jesus.

The first school, Bechem, gave us kids who knew the Bible stories better than some of the people at my church here in Madison. They must go to church every week and sometimes on Saturdays. The "preacher" taught them the stories and the law. What

he did not teach them is the gospel. He, himself, believed you must "be good" to go to heaven. They did not understand the forgiveness that we receive and the only way to heaven is belief in Jesus. Although we were only there for 4 days you could see some of the older kids start to understand. Pray that the seed of the gospel grows in their hearts. Some of the evangelists, that Pastors Reinke and Palmer were teaching, will go out to the school and continue teaching the gospel.

The second week we went to Jamasi. The children there barely knew any of the Bible stories and were hungry to hear them. Imagine 60-100 children just sitting there with complete focus because they want to hear the stories. That was amazing. The poverty at that school was not in money but in spirit. The teachers and headmaster at that school lacked God's love. There were a few shining lights among them but they were rare. Most just wanted us there so that we would give them things. Pray for the children at they school, they are so hungry to hear the word of God.

Culture shock-

One of the big shocks came when we went to a village outside of the city. 30% of the people there are deaf and they are extremely poor. It was the first time Ted saw real poverty. The Lutheran church supports 9 deaf children to go to school. If you would like to sponsor one you can contact us. For them to go to school it is about \$60 a year.

We hardly wait to get forms especially for the Skit/Banner/Choir competition. Send the forms to Jean





Coming Ghana Mission Trip...

Pastor John Reinke and Pastor Bud Palmer, both from Wisconsin, are going to Ghana in June, 2005. They go every six months for three weeks each time to teach deaf adults about Jesus and to prepare them to be evangelists and pastors. Each time they return with stories and more love for Jesus. Last year Alan Rork was invited to join them. This year it has been reported that Missionary Pat Monroe of Iowa is going.

Where is Ghana? Ghana is a small country in West Africa. Ghana has seven deaf schools all using American Sign Language. Ghana has a large deaf population. The Ghanaian deaf are anxious to hear about Jesus and God's love for them.

Some of the deaf adults walk three hours to meet to worship Jesus. After worship they walk three hours home and make this trip every Sunday without fail. Wow! They are happy to worship Jesus and to walk six hours every Sunday to show their love to the Lord.

You can help. It costs about \$6,000.00 per person to travel from Chicago to Ghana and return. Please make your donations to your home church or to ILDA and indicate it for Ghana travels.

2004- 2005 Mission Project Goal: \$26,000.00

Mill Neck Foundation Receives Crusader Grant

Mill Neck Foundation for Deaf Ministry was one of 33 grant recipients of the 2005 Long Island Lutheran High School Association's Lutheran Crusader Fund. The grant, which totals \$4,200, will help support the Foundation's Servanthood Project, an annual summer program in which Deaf teens from Mill Neck Manor take part in a service-based activity. This year, Mill Neck Manor students will travel to Florida with Barbara Lanman, Coordinator of Deaf Ministry, and Rev. William Wrede, chaplain, where they will assist in hurricane disaster relief. Previously, Servanthood has traveled to Jamaica, where the group helped to build a school for deaf children~ and to Idaho, where the students painted a lodge and cleaned trails at a camp.

Wrede says that the Servanthood offers each student the opportunity for outreach and growth. The goal, he explained, is for students to learn that they are valued children of God. "Our philosophy is that we are all given gifts and talents which God desires for us to share with others. We do not focus on our students' disabilities, but rather on the abilities that God has given them," Wrede said. "We feel there is no better way to build self-esteem in young people than in giving of oneself."

The grant annually recognizes a number of organizations that spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ and assist people in times of need through innovative programs. This year alone, Long Island Lutheran received 51 applications and will give \$75,000 in funding to 33 recipients.

Part of the Mill Neck Family of Organizations, Mill Neck Foundation for Deaf Ministry provides funds for a variety of ministries with the Deaf throughout the United States and the world in the areas of education, technology and ministry. 
