Don't Be Afraid!

When you read the story about the birth of Jesus in the Bible in Matthew 1 and Luke 1 & 2, four times you will read the words, "**Don't be afraid!**"

In Matthew 1:20, the angel is talking to Joseph, telling him not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife.

In Luke 1:13, he is talking to Zacharias in the temple.

In Luke 1:30, he is talking to Mary. In Luke 2:10, he is talking to the

shepherds.

He talks to different people with different education levels at different times about different situations. But still, the message is the same, *"don't be afraid."*


When the angel says don't be afraid, he means that God is in control, God can make everything work out for the best, God will make things work out for His glory and there is no need to be afraid. Whatever they were facing, God sent the same message, "Don't be afraid!"

God sends the same message to all of His children. He is in control, He is on the throne, we don't need to be afraid.

A good friend of mine is a missionary in Baghdad. He has been there for more than three years, and he has been a missionary in the Middle East for 20 years. He writes a daily diary that he shares online with his friends, his financial supporters and his prayer partners. Again and again he talks about shootings, bombings, kidnappings, families being chased out of their homes, businesses being forced to pay "protection" money, etc. Is he afraid? Not for himself. He knows where he is going. His wife has the same attitude, she isn't afraid. She knows that she belongs to Jesus and He is in control. They both know that if they die, they are going home to Heaven. But they are afraid for their many Muslim friends. They share the Gospel with them, they tell them about God's great love and about forgiveness that Jesus earned on the cross for us, but until their friends actually believe in Jesus, they are afraid for them. If they die without Jesus, it's just like any of our friends dying without Jesus - they are destined to an eternity separated from God, an eternity in hell.

We might face things that could scare us, but I want to remind you that God is in control, God is on His throne and He tells us, "Don't be afraid!" God sent His Son, Jesus, to take our sin and our punishment upon Himself, and He gives us forgiveness and eternal life so that we can live with Him forever. No matter what you are facing... Don't be afraid! Amen!

Rev. Palmer's Trip to Ghana...



Our trip to Ghana West Africa September 6th to the 16th 2006 was a different kind of trip than normal. Normally, Pastor Reinke and I don't go together anymore... we lead our own separate mission teams. Most often we go for 21 days instead of 10 days, also we usually go to teach and train but this time was a bit different. This time we went to do mostly administrative stuff. We wanted to check on the village land in Adomrobe, the building, and corn-milling machine. It was nice to see the corn machine on premises and not long from being set up for use. Hallelujah, The building is up... the roof, wooden windows, and door are the only things that need to be added. Amen!

However, we still don't have the official documents for the land but in Ghana once you build on the land... the land is yours! Praise the Lord!

After our visit to the village we headed up North to Kumasi to look at the land and talk with the chief and his elders there. The chief has given the deaf about 30 acres but is upset because nothing has been built. Pastor Reinke and I are not sure what to do but we said we will help as much as we can. We pledged to buy two brick building machines which are about 2 million cedes each (2 hundred dollars each), some sand, and cement. They will build a lean-too shed to cover the newly made bricks. They need to make about 5,000 bricks before they can start building the church and other buildings there.

We really need your help! Our vision is to one day have a LUTHERAN deaf high school, deaf university, and deal seminary. This will take about 2 million USA dollars. There has never been 1 deaf person go to college or university in Ghana. Ugh! Hopefully, all the deaf of Africa might want to come there for training. So, we did some teaching and training (We couldn't resist. Smile!) with the evangelists and four of them have now become vicars but we still have far to go!






Midwest Region ILDA...



Youth Servant Trip 2006... New Orleans, LA Hurricane Katrina clean up

Every year the youth from Trinity Lutheran Church of the Deaf, Sioux Falls, SD take a week out of their summer to do something few others their age do, they help others. This summer was no different. The morning of June 3rd they packed into a fifteen passenger van and headed out for Minneapolis. That was not the final destination, no, it was only the first stop on the way. In Minneapolis they traded their van for a plain, destination New Orleans, LA.

Upon arrival in New Orleans, we found the group from Wisconsin, got our rental vans and cars and headed for Salem Lutheran Church and school (this would be our home base for the week). That evening we organized our sleeping arrangements, went out to supper and went to bed.

Sunday morning began with worship lead by pastors Palmer and Nix. That afternoon we had nothing scheduled so we decided we would go to the Gulf and swim. That trip allowed us to begin to

the Gulf and swim. That trip allowed us to begin to see the level of devastation that had occurred.

Monday through Friday were spent gutting houses that had been flooded. To do this work everyone was required to dress in coveralls, heavy breathing mask, surgical gloves covered by leather palmed work gloves, safety glasses and steal shank rubber work boots. To say the least we were hot and sweaty and it was hard to breathe. The reason for this work attire was the great amount of mold and sharp objects in our work area. Gutting the houses meant just that, we took everything out of the house then we ripped the carpet, cabinets, kitchen and bath fixtures (including the tub). Next we tore the sheetrock out and finally the entire house was sprayed down with a heavy bleach mix to kill the remaining mold. It was wonderful to interact with the people of New Orleans. They were very quick to thank us for giving up our free time to help them.

We used some of our free time to tour the areas that had been most heavily hit by the storm and the following flood waters. One of the members of the Wisconsin group had live there and got out of town in time to miss the storm, this was his first time to go back. He showed us his apartment (that had not been touched yet) and his deaf church that was in the process of being fixed. One thing I noticed was that the storm and the flood waters did not play favorites. Neighborhoods of all economic levels were destroyed.

Saturday found us packing, doing a little more sightseeing and heading to the airport. After waiting an extra 1 to 2 hr for our plain we boarded and headed back to Minneapolis, found our van and arrived back in Sioux Falls early Sunday morning.

This was the sixth servant trip our youth have participated on. Each time we go it is a new opportunity for our youth to put into action the faith they have been learning about in our Bible studies. One major difference on this trip was that we invited adults to go with us. This was a nice addition and we will probably extend the invitation for future trips.

New Orleans Mission Trip...

We couldn't hear the hope and gratitude expressed by the people of Jefferson Parish in New Orleans. To us it didn't matter. Our team of four deaf with a pastor/interpreter are used to the world being silent. You didn't need to hear the words because .you could see it on their faces and feel it in their smiles.

From the air New Orleans looked like any other city I have flown into. The reason for this is because New Orleans survived the onslaught of Hurricane Katrina unlike Miss and Alabama.

What destroyed the city is the flooding afterwards. Most of the damage cannot be seen outside, you must go inside to view what happened. You can see some of the scars but it isn't until you go inside the houses that you see the chaos and mold.

We met up a team of 9 other deaf adults and youth from South Dakota. Everyday, we worked with Lutheran Disaster Relief, which has set up a tent city on the lawn of a church, to get our daily work assignments. The leader for our group was a man from North Carolina who has volunteered for 7 months in New Orleans. For one week we worked on a house and a duplex gutting both of the residents. Our day started by putting on coveralls, latex gloves, leather gloves, rubber boots, breathing masks, and goggles in 96-degree heat. It was both interesting and heartbreaking to do the work. Throwing out pictures and toys was not easy to do but we did have fun breaking the porcelain tub so it could be removed. EVERYTHING from inside the house had to go. Walls, ceiling fans, carpet and even the kitchen sink. By the end of the week all that was left was the frame of house showing what is really important in life.

For one member of my team going down to New Orleans was a homecoming. He was born and raised in New Orleans, one day before Katrina hit he fled wait out the storm with friends. Like most from New Orleans he expected to return home in less than a week. Now, nine months later he stood outside of his apartment for the first time. His apartment complex has been condemned, so could not go inside. Everything was destroyed. As we looked around the complex all we saw were things abandoned— baseball gloves, computers, Christmas decorations, police car— showing lives left behind. For my team member, he could finally have closure and move on with his life.

Coming back to Madison I could see the changes in my team. They are now closer than they were before. You can also see the pride knowing that they went to help other people. Maybe we are deaf but that doesn't mean that we can't do something. There is much left to be done in New Orleans and around the world. My question is— where should we go to next? Church of the Deaf, located in Queens, had a different approach in mind. Instead of their midweek Bible study being held at their church building in Queens or at Saint Peter's, they meet in the food court of one of Manhattan's most recognized skyscrapers. Beneath the roof that is cut at an angle, many stories below, is a food court where a faithful group has been meeting since last fall. "We call our group 'Fishers' since our purpose is to reach out to others who are

to reach out to others who are Deaf with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Instead of inviting people to our church in Queens, we decided to locate ourselves in a spot that is convenient, easily accessible by subway and bus, and close to fresh coffee," shared Pastor William Wrede, Mission Field Developer for the Deaf and Chaplain of the Mill Neck Family of Organizations.

The Fishers group meets each Wednesday, from 6 to 7 pm, at the Citigroup Center, located at 53rd Street and Lexington Avenue in Manhattan. "Fishers" found their new home among a group of ladies who gather to knit, men playing checkers, and individuals having their afternoon coffee and a break before heading home. "No one seems to mind us being there, and we've actually had more than just Deaf individuals express interest in what we are about," said Pastor Wrede. "From the group of ladies knitting, we've come to know a young lady who is studying to be a sign language interpreter. From the first week, we've met a variety of Deaf and hearing people. Through regular email announcements to the Deaf community in the New York City area, we continue to reach out to new people."

When asked about the goals of this group, Pastor Wrede explained, "Sure, we would love to think that these people would become part of our family in Queens. For now, and this is absolutely wonderful, they are part of God's Church and His family in this place. *'For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them.'* (Matthew 18:20)."

Pastor Wrede is the Chaplain for the Mill Neck Family of Organizations, the Pastor at Saint Matthew's Lutheran Church of the Deaf in Queens and at Saint Mark's Lutheran Church for the Deaf in Manhattan.
