Greetings in Christ to all of you. At the June 2007 ILDA Convention, I was elected as ILDA Pastoral Advisor. At the end of July I retired from active pastoral ministry in Indiana. My wife, Joyce, and I have moved to Florida. And I have accepted a part-time position as Florida-Georgia District Missionary at Large – Deaf [MAL-D] and am assigned to serve as the deaf missionary to Rogate Deaf Lutheran Church of Clearwater and the greater Tampa-St. Petersburg area.

After this lengthy introduction, we need to explain that we do have two daughters, both married, and four grand children. Also we have two dogs. Their names are Bernie and Bianca. They are black and white and are over seven-and-a-half years old. Bernie has the unique ability to talk to me. He has several tones in his bark and whines which tell me one thing or another. I recall when Bernie was a teething puppy. Yes dogs and humans grow baby teeth. Later they loose their baby teeth and grow permanent teeth. Bernie was teething. He would wake me up at 2 AM and have me a look that only he can give. Then he opened his mouth. I read his eyes and I knew what he wanted. And I rubbed his gums.

Now as an adult dog, Bernie sits and turns his face toward mine. I look into his eyes and understand that he is hungry or that he needs to go outside to do his business.

You ask, but what does that have to do with you, me and God? Jesus probably saw the same look in Simon Peter's eyes in John 6:68. Simon Peter asked Jesus, *"To whom shall we go? During a delightful weekend of September 15-16, 2007, Faith Lutheran Church of the Deaf celebrated its 80th Anniversary with invited guest, retired Rev. August Hauptman who first began his ministry to deaf people in Spokane/ Montana field back in 1945 as a vicar. Later during 1948 Rev. Hauptman was ordained and commissioned as missionary to the deaf in Montana and Spokane. He lived in Great Falls, MT, traveling 3,000 miles monthly to serve ten preaching stations in Montana and twice a month to Spokane. Then in 1952, Rev. John S. Salvner, the Executive Secretary for Deaf Missions announced that the Board had decided to move Rev. Hauptman and the field headquarters to Spokane because more deaf people in the field lived in Spokane. He gladly served there till April 1959 when he accepted a call to Minnesota Deaf Mission field centered at St. Paul, MN.

Everyone was delighted Rev. Hauptman brought along his beautiful wife, Ferrol and two daughters of his large family, Ida Baker/ husband Michael and Sarah Fannucchi. Other special people that came were retired Rev. and Sigrid Ludwig, Western

He gave good remarks toward Elmer Francisco, who was always eagerly waiting at the train station in Butte, MT and anxious to bring him to a deaf fellowship which grew monthly till ALL the deaf in town were gathered together to study God's Word! Rev. Hauptman had some nice regards for Arthur Anderson, Luther Sandberg and Victor Lyons for their dedicated and loving service and now at home with their Lord. They left behind their wives, Ella, Melba and Evelyn, all whom courageously in their old ages join the celebration.

The Anniversary theme was, *"Store up for yourselves treasures*" in heaven, for where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Matthew 6:20-21. Rev. Ludwig spiritually led the worship with the support of Deacon Kotal who shared the readings. Again, many of us enjoyed Rev. Hauptman's sermon and more humorous messages of how much he enjoyed having pride in himself and his large model train hobby, but reminded himself and us we must fight earthly pleasures in keeping our hearts open in God's treasure in heaven through our faith in Jesus Christ, who is now there with His abundant forgiveness and God's deep love for each of us.

Rev. William H. "Bill" Lange...

PEORIA - The Rev. William H. "Bill" Lange, 80, died on Nov. 1, 2007.

He was born Oct. 4, 1927, in Minot, ND. He married Ellen Westendorf on Oct. 18, 1955, in Long Beach, Calif. She survives. Also surviving are his four children, seven grandchildren.



He was a 1954 graduate of Concordia Theological Seminary in St. Louis, then serving throughout the nation. He was minister to the deaf in the central Illinois area, serving in Topeka, Ill., and later at Trinity Lutheran Church in Peoria.

Bill was ordained September 19, 1954. He served the following Deaf Mission fields: 1954-1960 Los Angeles, CA; 1960-1966 Denver, CO; 1966-1975 Omaha, NE; 1966-1968 Lincoln, NE; 1975-1984 St. Paul, MN; 1984-1993 Peoria, IL; and 1984-1993 Bloomington, IL. He retired in 1993.

Thanksgiving as the Americans are showing "thanksgiving living" at home and in church. They say such phrases but the Canadians do not do them. From my past teaching experiences at the Iowa School for the Deaf, I asked the class of high school students what is the purpose of thanksgiving. With interest, the American students responded with conscience that they should be thankful to the Lord who provides everything. Historically, the students learned that the Puritans originated the first Thanksgiving with the natives in Massachusetts the 1630s. Usually, the students returned home to reunite with their family and attend the special church service for the cold Thanksgiving weekend. It is clear that the Americans live their life in a mindset that always gives thanks to God. The Canadians had a rather quiet Thanksgiving weekend with their families and relatives in breezy October. They prayed with thanks to God for the turkey dinner and a pumpkin pie. Again, I asked the Canadian high school students for having a purpose of thanksgiving and they looked forward to having a restful weekend to eat turkey again and again after a short grace. They did not know where Thanksgiving comes from historically in Canada. Even, they did not attend the church service before Thanksgiving in Canada. However, I had to explain that Thanksgiving was the first idea in America in the past traditional October in both Canada and the United States for two hundred years. However, with Congressional approval, President Franklin D. Roosevelt issued a change of Thanksgiving date from October to November in the mid-1930s in order to encourage the Americans think of God as prayer and praise for God's blessings during the Great Depression. At Thanksgiving, we express our gratitude to God for His blessings and we offer a prayer before the dinner here and there. We should educate the unchurched people that Thanksgiving has a purpose for all of us to pray and praise to God with thanks. Happy Thanksgiving to all of you, American Lutherans!

Aside of thanksgiving, we wish all of you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year in recognition of our Jesus Christ's birth.






