In God We Trust

May 5, 2007, I think is the right date, a category-five tornado ripped apart Greensburg, Kansas. It is now a short 13 episode series on the Home channel right now. There are three reasons why I am watching this program. The first is that my child hood home was Kansas. I was born in Kansas and my siblings all live in Kansas. A second reason for watching this program is that my brother, Juan, and his wife were living in Greensburg that year. Fortunately they were not at home and were out of town during that tornado. A third reason why I watch that show is that I have been in that town for its tourist Mecca. The city has a meteorite museum and its huge collection of meteorites – is one of the largest in the world. Next to the museum is the largest hand dug well in the world. It is guite something. It is 32 feet in diameter and over 100 feet deep – ten stories down.

I can recall walking down the metal staircase to the bottom to see the water at the bottom. Last July I was able to visit Greensburg and to peer down into the well.

The well recalls for me a story I would like to share with you. Once upon a time – Andy Rooney would probably say that a good story should begin with those words "once upon a time." Once upon a time, there was this huge well. Two people were walking by and they looked into the well. They leaned over to look into the well. They fell. They fell all the way down to the bottom of the well. The water was not very deep and they were not hurt. Only their pride was hurt because of their stupidity. Now they began to yell. Obviously they were hearing people because deaf people would be signing "help." The two began to yell "help." For a long while nothing happened. Finally a passer by peered over the ledge and saw the two of them at the bottom of the well.

The person said, "Obviously this is a problem of your own making. God put me here and God put you there. There is nothing I can do. I am here and you are there. Now make the best of the situation and stop complaining." Then that person walked away and was never heard from again.

The two began to yell "help. We are stuck in the bottom of the well, Help." And after a long while, a second person stopped and looked over the edge and saw the two. He said, "what can I do for you?" The two said "get us a rope." That person then went to a barn and found a rope and brought it back. He threw the rope down into the well and said "here is the rope you asked for." He then promptly left and went on his own agenda.

The two began to yell some more. Finally a third person stopped and looked over the ledge and asked what the problem was. The two then explained what all had happened and about what the two previous people had said and done. The third person then went to get a rope. He then threw one end down into the well and held onto the other end. The two then were pulled up to safety.

Do you notice that when the two were being pulled up their hands were in the signing mode for "trust?" The person at the bottom has to trust that the person pulling them is not going to give up and then they would fall back to the bottom of the hole once again.

Do you see that this is what God does for you and for me? He holds onto us and does not let us go. We trust God will be there for us whenever we have problems. We trust God will hear our prayers. We trust God will answer our prayers. We trust God will not let us go. We trust God will not abandon us.

If you have a coin in your pocket, please retrieve it and look at the coin.

Quarters: If you have a quarter, turn over to the side with George Washington's face. The top of the coin for those who have the older version will say "liberty." Those with the newer state quarters will have the words "United States of America." Then in the middle of the quarter are some words. The older quarter it will be in front of President Washington and the new quarters will have the words behind his head.

The words on the coin are: "In God We Trust." Every U.S. coin has that phrase: "in God we trust." We need to remind ourselves that this country trusts in God. This November we Americans will again be electing a president to be our leader for the next four years and if reelected then for another four years. All of us need to exercise our right to vote by going to the polls in November. As you enter the voting booth, pray that God will give you a clear mind and ability to discern which candidate is the best person for that office. Every time you pick up a coin and read the words "in God we trust:" say a short prayer asking God to help our nation to trust in God.

Hi there!

I wanted to let you know how I'm doing on the Lessons Project. I have 60 lessons in various stages of completion. With each lesson, I start with an outline and then fill the outline. Once the complete outline is done, I break down the story further for more efficient teaching and storytelling. I break down the story by adding questions, emphasizing important points, and determining which pictures are needed. There are stories from both the Old Testament and New Testament.

The 60 lessons will be ready for use this fall. They will be distributed before the school year begins. 52 lessons will be enough for each week of the year, plus 8 extra. Since most churches don't teach lessons every week of the year due to summer time or holidays, the 60 lessons might be enough for more than one year's worth.

I am still working hard on this project and am looking forward to being able to share it with everyone else! It is so important to share the Gospel of our Lord Jesus with everyone, especially children.
