Christmas 2008 promises to be a special time for us and for man people. In our family we welcome a fifth grandchild into our midst. Children are the glue that makes many Christmases special. Their joyful anticipation is infectious to everyone. A child can make everyone around them full with joy.

Sometimes that joy can be snuffed out because of circumstances that make joy a difficult thing to embrace. It is almost like the movie, "The Grinch Who Stole Christmas." The Grinch thought that he could dampen everyone's spirits, if he stole all the presents and decorations in the village. But he could not steal people's joy. In the end, the Grinch joins in the Christmas celebrations.

Some years ago I made a pastoral visit to a family. In my December shut-in visit, I shared with them the joy of Christmas. I said that we anticipate Christmas Day and welcome the Christ Child into our homes and our hearts. However, the family rebuffed my devotional message. They said that in their house Christmas is canceled. To do that they do not plan to put up a Christmas tree, no cards, no gifts, no special meal, no presents, no special worship service. Nothing. De Nada. Nyet. Nein. Cancel everything.

The family had a sad year. They had some unforeseen financial disasters, a few deaths, and a few funerals, friends who moved away, job losses, hospital stays, medical bills and the list went on and on and on. Things did not look good for them that year. They canceled Christmas.

Perhaps that family may be how you feel this year. You too may be feeling depressed for perhaps some of the same reasons. Perhaps you too are thinking of canceling Christmas 2008.

Years ago in Judea there were a lot of people who felt the same way. They too felt as if God had abandoned them and left them alone. The economy was not good. The government was awful. Religious life was the pits. Nothing happened that seemed to be good. On top of all that, the head of government was Caesar Augustus and he lived thousands of miles away in Rome. Caesar Augustus decided that everyone had to go to their own home town to register for the census. Everyone had to travel at the same time. Everyone had to register at the same time.

Luke 2:1-3 "At that time the Emperor Augustus ordered a census of the Roman Empire. This was the first census taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All the people went to register in the cities where their ancestors had lived."

People and families were uprooted just to satisfy the tax increase plan of one man, Caesar Augustus, the Roman Emperor, who didn't care how this affected people and their lives.

One young lady was already nine months pregnant. Even she was not given a hardship waiver to avoid the trip from Nazareth to Bethlehem. Mary had to go – pregnant or not! God did this to put Mary of Nazareth into Bethlehem so that the Scriptures may be fulfilled.

Micah 5:2 "You, Bethlehem Ephrathah, are too small to be included among Judah's cities. Yet, from you Israel's future ruler will come."

The President's Report...

Greetings to all of you, my beloved subscribers in the name of Jesus Christ!

As you are aware, we have been getting a daily barrage on the news media about the ups and downs of stock markets around the world and how these swings are affecting our church and home budgets. Also, we see gang violence, drug trade, a blatant disregard for the law all over the place. The younger generation are exposed to immortality on TV, the internet and in the lives of their friends.

Locally, many parts of Canada have been warming at a rate that is twice the global warming. It is not hard to see the impact that climate change has already had on Canada : the storms that devastated forest trees, the floods of 2007, the wildfires of 2003 in Western Canada and California and the depletion of glaciers. These effects of global warming have taken a huge toll on our economy and livelihoods. It is clear that the global warming is hurting everybody in the world. It is time for all of us to take action.

The difference today is that we know them quickly. With 24/7 news stations and CNN news internet, every piece of information is scrutinized for readers and it is too engaging for them to listen to closely. We are too focusing on how everything is going on in the world.

Second, we were told that the world will be ended in the future regardless of when we do not know exactly. The ancient Mayan calendar stated that the world would have been ended in 2012. Nostradmaus of old France predicted

On 8 June 2008, Rev. William Wrede became the pastor of Redeemer Lutheran Church and School in Glendale and Saint Matthew Lutheran Church of the Deaf in Elmhurst. Both congregations are in Queens, part of New York City. This is the beginning of a new opportunity for one hearing and one deaf congregation to work together.

After serving Saint Mark (Manhattan), Saint Matthew (Queens), and the Mill Neck Foundation for Deaf Ministry (Long Island) since 2000, there was a need to evaluate Pastor Wrede's role and the future of ministry among the deaf in New York. Faced with difficult decisions, both Saint Mark and Saint Matthew prayed, had meetings, and made decisions.

Working with the Atlantic District and Redeemer, the people of Saint Matthew decided they were willing to set up a new partnership that will help ministry continue and grow. Both Redeemer and Saint Matthew make decisions and accept the responsibility to make things happen. Missions in North America, and 2) raising money for that Mission work.

ILDA has kindly given permission for LDMS to serve as that Mission Society. Is ILDA's work finished? No, sharing Jesus continues to be a growing need and blessing with the Deaf communities in North America. ILDA will be a partner with LDMS especially in the areas of 1) raising money for the Zacharias' scholarship fund to help more Deaf individuals become Pastors or Deaconesses and 2) continue to encourage mission work in other nations (Ghana, India, etc.)

Dr. Scudieri has asked Pastor Rynearson to help in organizing the expanded LDMS. He will be working on organizing it. As LDMS changes he will be the ad hoc leader. Pastor Dennis Konkel and Pastor John Reinke will assist him in the process.


