Taught By God

If you want to know who someone is, you can do several things.

For the sake of this article our person will be named Ben and he has a wife Clara and friends. His parents are still alive. First, you can ask Ben's parents. They will know intimately about Ben's early habits and character. They will know his schedule and other details of time, place and more from Ben's childhood years. Second, you can ask Clara. She will tell you all of the intimate thoughts of Ben when it comes to family and maybe even his goals and ambitions. Clara could tell you Ben's home habits and his schedule that revolved around the house and maybe work. Third, you can ask Ben's friends. They will also know Ben's character and maybe his habits when he is out and about. The friend will know his "favorite" things and a little bit of his history. All of these are ways to find out about Ben.

The problem with all of these sources of information is that they are all limited. Ben's parents know his childhood and many of his adult thoughts and actions,

but they have their own perspective and no longer live with Ben. Clara can tell you Ben's habits and thoughts, but only when they pertain to the home or maybe future goals. She won't know all of his work habits or thoughts of his job. His friends will have another view of Ben that is separate from parents and wife and therefore they will have unique information the previous people may not have. Yet, there is one thing missing. Can you guess?

No one talked to Ben! He is the direct source that will have all of the necessary information you need. He can tell you who he is based on his own thoughts and the reason behind his habits and his schedule. This is why autobiographies are always more accurate when it comes to an individual's identity.

Ok, so what about God? If you want to know God it is fine if you consult commentaries or other Christians. You can talk to professors and friends. But in the end, it's best if you hear it from God Himself. The only way to do that, is to listen to His Word. God tells us that His Word is written by His apostles and prophets. The Bible is the way we listen to God! But it isn't a one way conversation.

Communicate with God in prayer and then read or watch Him speaking in His Word, the Bible. Then you will be taught by the

Father, through the Son, in the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit uses the very Word of the Bible to teach you directly about the Father and the Son. Stay in the Word, ask the Father to give you His Spirit to help you understand it. Watch the Bible in ASL at Bible.is/deaf. Read your Bible. Your heavenly Father wants to tell you about Himself and His Son and His Spirit so don't miss the opportunity.

Later God sent the Apostle
Paul throughout the northeast
Mediterranean world, to tell the
Good News to people in places
that today we call Greece and Turkey. Paul never stayed in one
place very long. His visits lasted
only a few months, or even a few
weeks, until enemies of Christ
forced Paul to leave or they tried to
kill him.

After Paul shared the Gospel with people in Lystra, Derbe, Phillippi, Thessalonia, Berea, Corinth, and Ephesus, who stayed behind to serve as their pastors, their teachers, their shepherd? We read in Acts, "Paul and Barnabas appointed elders for them in each church. The elders had trusted in the Lord. Paul and Barnabas prayed and fasted. They placed the elders in the Lord's care." (Acts 14:23 NIRV). These elders were average people who were mature and they loved Jesus. They were hungry to know God's Word. They learned to be servant-leaders as God led them. The apostles continued teaching them long-distance through their letters.

Today several of our Lutheran Deaf congregations find themselves in a similar situation as those first Christian churches. In past generations we depended on hearing congregations of the LCMS for support to pay pastors of Deaf churches. Those days are gone. Several of our pastors continue serving in "retirement." Other Deaf churches share their pastor with a hearing congregation. A couple of our Deaf pastors support their families with other jobs while serving their churches part time. Some Deaf congregations have been absorbed into hearing

churches. And several of our Deaf churches have no pastor at all. Yet they continue to meet for worship and fellowship under lay-leaders, just like churches that the Holy Spirit planted through the Apostle Paul. Why do they meet? Because they love Jesus and they love each other as Christ's family.

We live in challenging times which test our commitment to Christ and His people. The Lutheran Deaf Mission Society (LDMS) is working to provide resources for equipping servant-leaders in both Deaf churches and interpreted ministries. Our website is www.DeafJesus.org.
