Greetings from not-so-warm Pflugerville, Texas (now, we're having wintry chill with below average

temperatures, no kidding! Brrr) in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ! By the way, Happy New Year 2024!

Now, it's hard to believe 2023 is already gone, with so many happenings, both unexpected and expected. As for me, God has blessed me in many ways, for example: spiritual growth at Jesus Sign workshop week, some wonderful Christian fellowships with both new and old friends, visiting family and friends on our trips, etc. However, I had some unexpected occurrences, one of which was the loss of my best friend, Debbie (who was Deaf and blind) since we were 4 years old. On the bright side, she is now with Jesus because of her faith in Him and I will see her again when my time comes! In October, I was in Minneapolis, MN to attend a Celebration of Life for her at the beautiful Minnehaha Falls Park where I was one of five people to give a eulogy. There was a big attendance. I would say, at least 100 people, so obviously, Debbie was really well loved!

Now, let me share two combined sermons of our former pastor at our church, Bethany Lutheran and my husband, Rev. Mark Seeger. The theme of the sermon was "A Whole New You!" The celebration of the New Year. both pastors used one of the Bible verses: "If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come; the old has gone, the new is here!" (2 Cor. 5:17) Let us make this verse our number one New Year resolution! It is to cast out our old identity and create our new identity with Christ by being reconciled to God completely. In order to become a whole new person, we need to be reconciled to God and become righteous in Him. How can we do this? In Rev. Seeger's message: Every year on Dec. 31st at midnight, a new year begins. People all over the world celebrate the New Year. It happens every year. Some people like to make New Year's resolutions.

What's a resolution? It's a decision to do something to improve yourself. For example: 1) exercise more often, 2) eat healthier, 3) go out and help less fortunate people, 4) manage money better, etc. There is nothing wrong with trying to improve yourself. Actually it's good to try to get rid of bad habits and develop good habits. Trying to change from the way you were to the way you want to become is great. You might want to become a more caring person by stop arguing, become friendlier or more forgiving, or more helpful, etc.

What's the best way to become the new you? Let

God do it! He wants to change you! Read Ezekiel 11:19; Eph. 4:22-24; Col. 3:9-10 and 1 Peter 1:3.

It's rather interesting that Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, falls on Valentine's Day this year. It's interesting

because the weeks leading up to Easter are a time to explore the theme of love – God's love. "God so loved the world," the Gospel of John declares, "that He gave His Only-Begotten Son." Anyone who doesn't understand why Jesus suffered, died, and rose again, doesn't understand love.



Sin is an offense against God. His holy, divine justice demands punishment for our law-breaking. We face death – eternal death. Yet God doesn't desire the death of anyone.

 Production is wrapping up of the 60-lesson video course on church history being done by Bob Lenderman in American Sign Language (ASL). When completed he will return to his first love, translating Scriptures into ASL so those whose heart language is ASL will have access to the Word of God.

DIT: Deaf Institute of Theology

- LDMS continues to support students studying to become pastors and deaconesses at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. The seminary has a covenant with the students so that the seminary pays one third of the student's tuition, their district pays one third and the student and congregation pay one third. With LDMS' partnership with ILDA, financial assistance is offered up to the full amount that the student and congregation owe.
- Seminary level courses can be challenging for students whose first language is ASL and use English as a second language. The seminary has given access to the coursework so supplemental help can be created for the students. This is time consuming work. Much of the work has been done, but there are significant materials still to do. Many thanks to those who are producing the materials and to those who are supporting this effort.

World Lutheran Deaf Outreach (WLDO) News

- The 2023 Jesus Signs Immersion was an astounding success! Over 100 deaf and hearing people attended for a week of fun, learning and fellowship. The 2024 Jesus Signs Immersion will be held July 22-26, 2024. June training in West Africa saw over 50 deaf people attending for two weeks of intense training. The final Sunday the ELCG (Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ghana) ordained the first Deaf Ghanaian pastor! [Editor's note: see Page 6 of this issue for a photo.]
- Eight deaf students are studying to become Pastors and Deaconesses!
- Zoom and online training groups are being done in the USA and around the world.
- The Ghana Mission team (Rev. Dr. John Reinke, Deaconess Rebecca Catchpole and Seminarian Johnny Szupica) traveled to Accra, Ghana on 12/28/2023—1/12/2024 to train the deaf leaders there from Ghana and Liberia.
- Plans are being made for 2024 training in India, Papua New Guinea and Africa. Prayers are appreciated.


